Safety Information

The heater is designed for use as a construction heater in accordance with ANSI Z83.7, CSA 2.14. Other standards govern the use of fuel gases and heating products for specific uses. Your local authority can advised you about these. The primary purpose of construction heaters is to provide temporary heating of building under construction, alteration or repair. Properly used, the heater provides safe economical heating. Products of combustion are vented into the area being heated.

We cannot foresee every use which may be made of our heaters. CHECK WITH YOUR LOCAL FIRE SAFETY AUTHORITY IF YOU HAVE QUESTIONS ABOUT HEATER USE.

Other standards govern the use of fuel gases and heat producing products for specific uses. Your local authorities can advise you about these.

Carbon monoxide polsoning: Some people are more affected by carbon monoxide than others. Early signs of carbon monoxide poisoning resemble the flu, with headaches, dizziness and/or nausea. If you have these signs, the heater may not be working properly. **Get fresh alr at once!** Check for proper ventilation and have heater serviced.

Propane gas: Propane gas is odorless. An odor-making agent is added to propane gas. The odor helps you detect a propane gas leak. However, the odor added to propane gas may fade. Propane gas may be present even though no odor exists.

Make certain you read and understand all Warnings. Keep this manual for reference. It is your guide to safe and proper operation of this heater.

- Install and use heater with care. Follow all local ordinances and codes. In the absence of local ordinances and codes refer to the Standard for Storage and Handling of Liquefied Petroleum Gas, ANSI/NFPA 58 and the Natural Gas Installation Code, CSA B149.1. This instructs on the safe storage and handling of propane gas.
- Use only propane gas set up for vapor withdrawal.
- Provide adequate ventilation. Before using heater, provide at least a six-square-foot opening of fresh, outside air. This heater produces carbon monoxide, which is listed by the State of California as a reproductive toxin under Proposition 65.
- For indoor or outdoor use.
- For either indoor or outdoor use. Adequate ventilation shall be provided in accordance with OSHA 29 CFR 1926.154, Safety Requirements for Temporary and Portable Space Heating Devices and Equipment ANSI A10.10, ANSI 223.1 / NFPA 54, Liquified Petroleum Gas Code, NFPA 58 or the National Gas and Propane Installation Code, CAN B149.1 as appropriate.

- Do not use heater in occupied dwellings or in living or sleeping quarters.
- Do not use heater in a basement or below ground level. Propane gas is heavier than air. If a leak occurs, propane gas may sink to the lowest possible level.
- Keep appliance area clear and free from combustible materials, gasoline, paint thinner and other flammable vapors and liquids. Dust is combustible. Do not use heater in areas with high dust content.
- The heater must be located at least 6 ft. (1.83 m) in the U.S.; or (ii) 10 ft. (3 m) in Canada, from any propane gas container.

- Keep propane tank(s) below 100°F (37.8 °C).
- Check heater for damage before each use. Do not use a damaged heater.
- Use only the hose and factory preset regulator provided with the heater.
- Check hose before each use of heater. If highly worn or cut, replace with hose specified by manufacturer before using heater.
- Do not alter heater. Keep heater in its original state.
- Do not use heater if altered.
- Locate heater on stable and level surface if heater is hot or operating.
- Not intended for use on finished floors.
- Never block air inlet (bottom of shell) or air outlet (around top of shell) of heater.
- Do not leave heater unattended.
- · Keep children and animals away from heater.
- Never move, handle or service a hot or operating heater. Severe burns may result. Wait 15 minutes after turning heater off.




Fig. 1 Convection Heater parts identification.

Theory of Operation

The Fuel System: The hose/regulator assembly attaches to the propane gas supply. This provides fuel to the heater.

The Ignition System: The piezo ignitor lights the burner fuel supply on the LPC25/80. The piezo ignites a pilot burner on the LPC200.

The Automatic Control System: The automatic control valve shuts off the heater if the flame goes out.

Propane Supply

You must provide propane gas and tank(s).

Use this heater only with a propane vapor withdrawal supply system. Installation must conform to local codes or, in the absence of local codes, with the standard for the Storage and Handling of Liquefied Petroleum Gases ANSI/NFPA 58 and the Natural Gas and Propane Installation Code CSA B149.1. Your local library or fire department will have this booklet.

The amount of propane gas ready for use from propane tanks varies. Two factors decide this amount:

- 1. The amount of liquid propane gas in tank(s).
- 2. The temperature of tank(s).

The chart below shows the minimum number of 100pound tanks or one larger tank may be needed in colder weather. Your local propane gas dealer will help you select the proper supply system.

Heater Assembly

- 1. Remove all packing items applied to heater for shipment. Keep plastic cover caps (attached to connector inlet and regulator hose assembly) for storage.
- 2. Remove all items from carton and check for shipping damage. If heater is damaged, promptly inform dealer where you purchased the heater.



CAUTION: Do not attempt to light heater until fully assembled.




Fig. 2 Slide upper shell assembly up and off lower shell.




Fig. 3 Remove regulator hose assembly, place four screws in bottom holes at top of lower shell.

- 3. Slide upper shell assembly up and off lower shell. LPC80/200 (Fig. 2)
- 4. Remove regulator hose assembly bag from inside base.
- 5. Screw four phillips head screws in place in bottom hole at top of lower shell. LPC80/200 (Fig. 3)




Fig. 4 Attach top with four phillips screws.

- Place upper shell assembly onto shell lower. Secure with four phillips screws in top hole of lower shell. (Fig. 4)

- 7. Provide propane supply system. (Refer to Propane Supply on Page 3)




Fig. 5 Attach regulator with vent pointing down.

- 8. Connect fuel gas fittings on regulator hose assembly to propane tank(s). Turn fuel gas fitting counterclockwise into threads on tank. Tighten firmly using a wrench. **IMPORTANT:** Tighten regulator with vent pointing down. Pointing vent down protects regulator from weather damage. (Fig. 5)




Fig. 6 Hose and connector inlet.

- 9. Connect hose to the connector inlet. (Fig. 6) Use a wrench to prevent connector inlet on heater from turning as you tighten firmly using a wrench. You must use the regulator supplied with heater even if propane tank has one.

- Open propane supply valve on propane tank(s) slowly. NOTE: If not opened slowly, excess-flow check valve on propane tank may stop gas flow. If this happens, you may hear a click inside the regulator assembly, this is the check valve closing. To reset the excess-flow check valve, close propane supply valve and open it again slowly.
- 11. Check all connections for leaks. Apply mixture of liqud soap and water to gas joints. Bubbles forming show a leak that must be corrected before using the heater.

Close propane supply valve.

Operation

Lighting/Operating Instructions RMC-LPC25/80

CAUTION

Due to high surface temperature, keep children, clothing and furniture away.

Keep burner and control compartment clean.

This heater shall not be installed in a bedroom or a bathroom.

WARNING

Hot while in operation: Do not touch. Keep children, clothing, furniture, gasoline and other liquids having flammable vapors away.

NOTE: On completing the gas line connection, a small amount of air will be trapped in the gas line. When you first light the unit with the pilot light, it is possible that it will take a few minutes to purge the trapped air. Once you have purged the gas line, the pilot and burner will light and operate normally. Subsequent lightings of the appliance will not require purging the gas line.

- 1. Stop! Read the safety information on side of heater.
- 2. Turn control knob clockwise / to "OFF"(O)position.
- 3. Turn propane supply valve on by turning tank valve counterclockwise
- 4. Depress control knob and turn counterclockwise to "LOW/IGN" position to light burner.
- If burner does not light, turn knob to the "OFF" (○) position and repeat Step 4. Keep control knob depressed for approximately 10 to 15 seconds, release control knob.
- 6. If flame burner goes out, wait 5 minutes then repeat steps 4 and 5.
- With burner operating, the control knob may be turned counterclockwise
 to desired heating level between "LOW" and "HIGH."

To Turn Off Appliance

- 1. Turn control knob clockwise \frown to "OFF" \bigcirc position.
- 2. Turn propane supply valve off by turning fully clockwise




Fig. 7 Convection Heater control knob.

Lighting/Operating Instructions RMC-LPC200



WARNING: BEFORE LIGHTING PILOT, close main burner valve (by rotating the handle clockwise).

Start: Read Safety Information before starting the heater.

- Fully open the valve on the propane cylinder counter clockwise
 And wait 15 seconds before proceeding to step 2.
- 2. Depress the red button on safety pilot valve admitting gas to the pilot. Push and release the ignition button until the pilot lights.
- **3.** When the pilot lights, continue to hold button depressed for the 30 seconds then release.
- **4.** If pilot goes out, wait 5 minutes and repeat lighting procedure.

5. When the pilot remains lit, open main burner valve to operate heater. Partially close valve to regulate heat output.

STOP:

- 1. Securely close valve on the propane cylinder.
- 2. Close main burner valve.

RESTART AFTER SAFETY SHUTDOWN

- 1. Securely close valve at propane cylinder.
- 2. Wait 5 minutes.
- 3. Restart following "Start" procedure.

Troubleshooting

RMC-LPC25/80/200 Propane Convection Heater

Burner fails to light	 Propane supply valve closed on propane tank(s). Excess-flow check valve closed. Blockage in burner nozzle. Piezo ignition system not sparking. 	 Open propane supply valve slowly. Close propane supply valve on propane tank and reopen slowly. Replace burner nozzle. Check to assure ignitor electrode gap is .196" (4.98 mm). Check wire lead for damage.
Burner lights but goes out when automatic control valve button is released	 Not enough warm-up time. Low gas pressure. Thermocouple loose or needs to be replaced. Automatic control valve needs to be replaced. 	 Relight, hold automatic control valve button in 45 seconds. Check propane tank(s) for proper gas supply. Tighten connection or replace thermocouple. Replace automatic control valve.
Burn rate is low	 Main burner valve not fully open. Plugged gas orifices. Low gas pressure. Low fuel supply. 	 Fully open main burner valve by turning control knob towards HIGH position until it stops. Replace gas orifice. Check gas supply; check regulator output. Consult propane gas supplier.

Maintenance



WARNING: Never attempt to service heater while it is connected to propane supply, operating or hot. Severe burns can occur.

- 1. Keep heater clean.
- 2. Inspect heater before each use. Check connections for leaks. Apply mixture of liquid soap and water to connections. Bubbles forming show a leak that must be corrected. Correct all leaks at once.
- 3. Inspect regulator hose assembly before each use. If hose is highly worn or cut, replace with hose specified by manufacturer.
- 4. Have heater inspected yearly by a qualified service person.

Storage



CAUTION: Disconnect heater from propane supply tank(s).

- 1. Store propane tank(s) in safe manner. Refer to Chapter 5 of Standard for Storage and handling of Liquefied Petroleum Gases, ANSI/NFPA 58, and the Natural Gas and Propane Installation Code CSA B149.1. Follow all local codes. Always store propane tanks outdoors.
- 2. Place plastic cover caps over brass fittings on connector inlet and regulator hose assembly.
- 3. Store in a dry, clean and safe place.




